Bunn High Opens New Agriculture Building

As part of the \$30 million school bond passed in 2004, Bunn High School received a new agricultural building that also houses carpentry classes. Agriculture teacher Bob Frisbee is quite pleased with the new facility. Students are no longer confined to a small area. In the past, many projects had to be completed outside and construction schedule was dependent on weather. But now, students can work on the majority of their projects inside. There is a new welder's room with plenty of electrical access and there are also five locations to access compressed air.

In addition, the new sink area is larger and students can ready much quicker for their next class. Delivery trucks can now back into the facility, rather than unload outside. This, again, saves more time.

"The kids are going to benefit from this facility," Frisbee said. "This is a better layout and a safer environment, and it is more efficient." The new building is 8,000 square feet.

The carpentry side of the building is also getting new equipment, including a dust collection system.
