

What Is SES?

As a parent, if you have concerns regarding your child's academic progress, there is a program that you'll want to learn more about. The program is Supplementary Educational Services (SES) which is a free tutoring service for any student who qualifies for free and/or reduced lunch at Franklinton Elementary School or Louisburg Elementary School.

When students are attending Title I schools that have not made adequate yearly progress (AYP) in increasing student achievement for three years, parents of eligible children will be provided with opportunities to ensure that their children achieve at high levels. Students from low-income families who are attending a Title I school are eligible for the free tutoring services after school. The supplementary educational services must be high quality, research-based and specifically designed to increase student academic achievement.

If your child qualifies for free or reduced lunch, and attends either Franklinton Elementary School or Louisburg Elementary School, please come discover all you need to know to choose the best program for your child at the vendor fairs. Louisburg Elementary School will host their vendor fair on September 13 from 7-8:30 p.m. and Franklinton Elementary on September 18 from 7-8:30 p.m. The following ten providers will be available at the fair to share information with which you may find the best match for your child's academic needs:

Applications will be available at the fair and at your child's home school, for parents to select their top three choices. The deadline for submitting applications to your child's school is September 17 at Louisburg Elementary School and September 21 at Franklinton Elementary School. Parents will be notified of the program their child was enrolled by mid-October. The tutoring program, which begins November 1, will operate on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m. with transportation provided by the schools.
